Attendance Policies

- Attendance is taken once daily for Elementary students, and every period for Middle School through High School students
- Students that arrive before attendance is taken, but after the bell, are counted tardy.
 Tardies will not be calculated towards truancy, but excessive tardies could be subject to disciplinary action.
- If your student is absent for ANY part of the day, you must submit a note to the Attendance Clerk or Registrar for the absence to be considered excused.
- You will receive an absence notification call and/or email when your student has been marked absent. This is a friendly reminder to submit a note to your Attendance Clerk or Registrar.

How do I turn in notes if my child is absent?

48 Hours

Notes can be emailed or brought in-person to your campus Attendance Clerk within 48 hours upon your student's return to their campus.

For an absence to be considered excused, please provide the following details:

- FIRST and LAST name
- Grade & Student ID number (if known)
- Date of Absence
- Reason for Absence
- Parent's Name & Contact Information

3 Business Days

Please allow a minimum of 3 business days for your campus Attendance Clerk to update your child's record.

What is Truancy and the 90% Rule?

What is the 90% Rule?

- The Texas attendance rules say that a student has to be in a class at least 90% of the time if they want to be sure to get credit for that class. This rule applies even if your child has an Individualized Education Program (IEP) or Section 504 plan.
- The 90% rule includes both excused and unexcused absences combined.
- Students who miss more than 10% of the school year may be at risk for:
 - Loss of credit at secondary school levels.
 - Not being promoted to the next grade level.
 - Making up hours and working with Assistant Principals to regain credit(s).
- Hutto ISD will:
 - Evaluate all unexcused absences.
 - Provide interventions for students with attendance concerns.
 - Work to remove barriers for students and families with the ultimate goal for all students to graduate on time.



What is truancy in Texas?

- A school district is required to adopt truancy prevention measures under §25.0915.[17]
 If a student has three or more unexcused absences for three or more days or parts of
 days within a four-week period but less than 10 or more days or parts of days within a
 six-month period, the district shall initiate truancy prevention measures.
- Hutto ISD is required to:
 - Monitor students' attendance.
 - Notify students and parents of attendance concerns.
 - Educate students and parents about Hutto ISD attendance policies.
 - Inform students and parents of Texas laws regarding attendance.

What happens if unexcused absences continue for my child?

Truancy Commitment

After 6 unexcused absences you will be asked to meet with your student's campus Administrator to discuss their attendance and sign a Truancy Commitment

Referrals to Truancy Court:

- Students under 12 A Parent Contributing complaint may be filed which can result in a Class C Misdemeanor that carries a fine.
- Students over 12 A Student and Parent Contributing complaint may be filed depending on the circumstances for the absences.

Possible Truancy Court Actions:

- Court Order to attend school, classes, programs, and/or workshops
- Court Ordered GED
- Court Assigned Monitor
- Mandatory Community Service
- Potential Fines for Parents and Students
- Suspension of Student's Driver's License
